Accessing Government Contracts

<u> Tip # 1</u>

Register with the <u>Aboriginal Business Directory WA</u> or <u>Supply Nation's Indigenous Business Directory</u>. Registration on these directories is free. Keep your listing accurate and up to date. These directories are one of the first places a WA government buyer looks for an Aboriginal business directly. The lists are also used to check the capability of Aboriginal businesses. Large contractors and corporations also look to these sites for contractors and subsidies.

<u> Tip # 2</u>

Have an up-to-date capability statement and have in mind a couple of clients who can confirm your capability. Government policy allows agencies to tender directly with Aboriginal businesses up to a set dollar value. However, they need to see you have the capacity and capability to fulfil the contract.

<u>TIP # 3</u>

Governments fund several organisations to help you grow your business, secure government contracts, and be introduced to larger firms as potential subcontractors. Try the different agencies. Find an adviser or mentor that understands you, and you are comfortable working with. The organisations are often contracted for several years. You might as well use their services.

<u> Tip #4</u>

Have an up-to-date business website. If your business relies on Facebook or another social media page, government agencies may not be able to access it due to IT restrictions.

Business Opportunities with Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley (SWEK)

Register with <u>Vendor Panel</u> and the <u>WA Aboriginal Business Directory</u>. The Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley (SWEK) uses Vendor Panel to list business opportunities and to identify relevant suppliers. Keep your listing accurate and up to date. Listing as a supplier on Vendor Panel is free, but additional services may need a subscription to be paid.

Council Policies enable Aboriginal businesses that demonstrate their capability to secure contracts up to \$250,000 without tendering. Your business may also benefit from a local supplier cost margin: Telephone Council's Procurement and Contracts Officer.

Business Opportunities with Shire of Halls Creek

Register with <u>TenderLink</u>. The Shire of Halls Creek uses Tender Link to advertise requests for Tenders and Expressions of Interest. Suppliers and subcontractors registered <u>with TenderLink</u> can receive email notifications of any Shire of Halls Creek tender opportunities. Registration is free.

(Yes, it would be great to have just one online tender system, but each Council has its own way of doing things).
